

I. Treasury Transfers to EDL in December 2014

In December 2014, treasury transfers to EDL reached LL 429.66 billion, as follows:

⇒ Reimbursement of KPC and Sonatrach

LL 428.99 billion

⇒ Debt Service

LL 0.67 billion

II. Treasury Transfers to EDL in 2014 in comparison with 2013

Transfers to EDL in year 2014 were LL 101.37 billion higher than the 2013 year level

Transfers in year 2014 were LL 101.37 billion higher than the amount paid during year 2013, which stood at LL 3,055.66 billion. This was due to higher reimbursement to KPC and Sonatrach for fuel oil and gas oil purchases during 2014.

Payments to the two oil suppliers in Jan-Dec 2014 were LL 134.65 billion higher than their level during Jan-Dec 2013

The component "Reimbursement for purchase of Gas and Fuel" reached LL 3,124.92 billion in Jan-Dec 2014, up from LL 2,990.28 billion in Jan-Dec 2013.



III. Contribution of EDL out of the total oil bill

▶ EDL contributed 3.2 percent of the total oil bill in Jan-Dec 2014

From a total oil bill of LL 3,227 billion in Jan-Dec 2014, EDL contributed by 3.2 percent to the cost of gas oil and fuel oil purchase¹. This figure was lower at 2.6 percent during the same period of 2013, out of a lower bill of LL 3,071 billion. In nominal terms, EDL's contribution in Jan-Dec 2014 amounting LL102 billion, was higher than its contribution during Jan-Dec 2013, amounting LL 81 billion.

¹ The Treasury transferred LL 3,157.04 billion to cover EDL's deficit in Jan-Dec 2014. Out of this amount, LL 3,124.92 billion represented the Treasury transfer to purchase gas oil and fuel oil (as shown in Table 2). However, the total oil bill for Jan-Dec 2014 amounted to LL 3,227 billion, which correspond to around LL 3,124.92 billion of Treasury transfers plus around LL102 billions of payments made by EDL.

IV. Shares of "Transfers to EDL" out of Expenditures

Transfers to EDL stood at 21.9 percent of primary expenditures during Jan-Dec 2014

With primary expenditures at LBP 14,430 billion in Jan-Dec 2014, the share of transfers to EDL reached 21.9 percent, a slightly higher share than that paid in Jan-Dec 2013 which stood at 21.0 percent of total primary expenditures.
