

I. Treasury Transfers to EDL in November 2015

► In November 2015, treasury transfers to EDL reached 132.26 LL billion, as follows:

⇒ Reimbursement of KPC and Sonatrach	130.99 LL billion
⇒ Debt Service	1.27 LL billion

II. Treasury Transfers to EDL in 2015 in comparison with 2014

► Transfers to EDL in Jan-Nov 2015 were 1357.89 LL billion lower than the Jan-Nov 2014 level

Transfers in Jan-Nov 2015 were 1357.89 LL billion lower than the amount paid in Jan-Nov 2014, which stood at 2,948.53 LL billion. This was mainly a result of lower payments to KPC and Sonatrach for fuel oil and gas oil purchases.

► Payments to the two oil suppliers in Jan-Nov 2015 were LL 1,354.76 billion lower than their level during Jan-Nov 2014.

The component "Reimbursement of KPC and Sonatrach Agreements" reached LL 1,562.32 billion in Jan-Nov 2015, down from LL 2,917.08 billion in Jan-Nov 2014. This 46.4 percent

decrease was mainly driven by lower average prices of crude oil and lower quantity of fuel and gas oil purchases.

➤ **From a quantity-effect viewpoint:**

- % Change in Quantity of Fuel Oil imported: 1.78% ▼
- % Change in Quantity of Gas Oil imported: 3.93% ▲

➤ **From a price-effect viewpoint:**

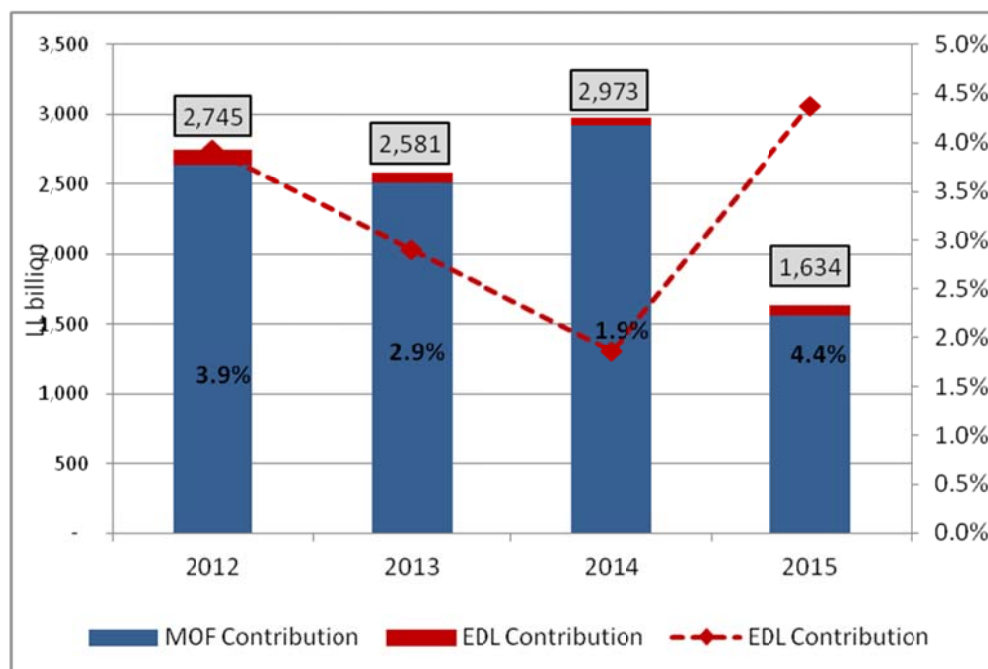

III. Contribution of EDL out of the total oil bill

▶ *EDL contributed by 4.4 percent of the total oil bill in Jan-Nov 2015*

From a total oil bill of LL 1,633.85 billion in Jan-Nov 2015, EDL contributed by 4.4 percent to the cost of gas oil and fuel oil purchase¹. This figure was at 1.9 percent during the same period of 2014, out of a higher bill of LL 2,972.69 billion. In nominal terms, EDL’s contribution was higher in Jan-Nov 2015, amounting to LL 72 billion, compared to LL 56 billion during the same period in 2014.

IV. Shares of “Transfers to EDL” out of Expenditures

▶ *Transfers to EDL constituted 13.5 percent of primary expenditures in Jan-Nov 2015*

¹ The Treasury transferred around LL 1,590.63 billion to cover EDL’s deficit in Jan-Nov 2015. Out of this amount, around LL 1,562.34 billion represented the Treasury transfer to purchase gas oil and fuel oil (as shown in Table 2). However, the total oil bill for Jan-Nov 2015 amounted to LL 1,634 billion, which correspond to LL 1,562.34 billion of Treasury transfers plus LL 72 billion of payments made by EDL.

With primary expenditures at LL 11,791 billion, the share of transfers to EDL reached 13.5 percent. This share was higher at 23.3% in Jan-Nov 2014.
